

Kids First Accomplishments Report – Spring 2012

Accomplishments

Accomplishments of the various Kids First committees, networks and working groups include:

- To develop local responses that improve the well-being of young children and their families
- ✓ Creation and distribution of over 500 Growth Charts containing information on developmental milestones and community resources
- ✓ 19% of children who participated in the Healthy Toddler Visit have been referred to other service providers and professionals for early intervention
- ✓ Approximately 90% of children eligible to start kindergarten have been screened at the Calling All Three Year Olds (CATYO) kindergarten registration in each of the last five years
- ✓ The percentage of children who have screened 'positive' at CATYO has decreased from 12% in 2006 to 5% in 2010
- ✓ All About Me portfolio developed to assist parents who have children with special needs to manage information
- In Clinton, young parents with children are able to access parent education as a result of a partnership between the Avon Maitland District School Board, the Ontario Early Years Centre and Huron County Children's Services
- To increase awareness of the importance of healthy child development
 - World Breastfeeding Week events held throughout Huron and Perth counties
 - ✓ Breastfeeding Buddies Support Group started in Stratford
 - ✓ Early Literacy events attended by over 1,200 parents and children
 - ✓ Over 300 parents and professionals attended a forum featuring Dr. Duncan McKinlay, a psychologist from CPRI
 - Community fair attended by 500 adults, 600 children and 120 vendors

To increase access to services

- Creation and distribution of over 400 Diversity and Inclusion Resource Guides
- Bluewater Area Family Health Team, Clinton Family Health Team, Grand Bend Community Health Centre, Maitland Valley Family Health Team, and North Huron Family Health Team are all participating in the Healthy Toddler Visit – Huron County's enhanced 18 month well baby visit
- Nine service providers have partnered in the establishment of a Best Start Child and Family Centre pilot project at Holy Name School in St. Marys
- ✓ Third party viability checks by school boards in all full day kindergarten schools and work to increase access to before and after school care for 3-6 year olds



- Occupational therapy, physiotherapy and recreational therapy for children under six are now available in Huron and Perth counties
- ✓ Establishment of a Best Start Child and Family Centre in each of Huron County's five major settlement areas
- ✓ Service providers have come together to provide a variety of services in 'at risk' neighbourhoods

To strengthen the capacity of the service system

- ✓ Diversity and inclusion workshop attended by 40 individuals
- ✓ Huron and Perth county child care providers participated in Raising the Bar on Quality and in professional development and mentorship activities
- ✓ Development of an Aboriginal Awareness Kit for Perth County service providers
- ✓ 250 professionals attended a conference for Early Childhood Educators in Stratford
- ✓ Paediatric Day attended by 110 health care practitioners
- ✓ Huron Perth Service Directory for Children's Services (0-6) updated and distributed to primary care practitioners and other service providers
- ✓ Kindergarten teachers at both school boards attended the first ever joint professional development day with Dr. Jean Clinton as their guest speaker
- Licensed child care programs in Huron and Perth counties are supported in their efforts to transition to a 'new' child care system
- ✓ 30 healthcare professionals attended the 20-hour Level I breastfeeding course

To evaluate the effectiveness of the local service system

- ✓ Service Integration Survey conducted to determine the level of communication, coordination, cooperation and integration that exists within each county
- ✓ Parents who did not attend Calling All Three Year Olds (CATYO) were surveved
- ✓ Survey conducted of the utilization of the CATYO calendar
- ✓ Early Development Instrument (EDI) and Kindergarten Parent Survey (KPS) administered every three years
- Evaluation of the Calling All Three Year Olds program conducted annually and shared with funders and partner agencies
